However if they can't don't forget that a little bit of reading (Independent or via audiobook), a bit of free writing (a diary or write about their favourite things), playing with some lego (or building blocks, playdough or origami), some art (drawing or colouring) or physical exercise. They could even make a project on something they really like and are interested in.
