Reception and Year 1

Reception

In Reception the children have been learning about the topic Winter Wonderland. During this topic the children have learnt about hibernating animals, habitats and changes in states of matter. We have especially enjoyed exploring what happens to ice and snow when it gets hot.

In oracy and writing the children have enjoyed the books The Gruffalo's child and One snowy night. The children have talked about these books, ordered the story and written about the characters.

The children also had the opportunity to visit the cresset before Christmas to watch the Wizard of Oz pantomime and also walked to the church to learn about Christingles.

Year 1

In Year 1, we have been learning about materials and their properties. We even went on a material hunt around school and described the properties of the materials found.

Our writing has been based around a book called 'Earth to Stella', which we used to create our own aliens. Next Block, our writing will revolve around the funny book 'The Day the Crayons Quit'.

We have really enjoyed learning about the history of transport and looking at the way travel has changed over time. As our history unit ends, we will move onto our next geography topic, where we will be looking at animals, habitats and where we live.







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Years 2 and 3

Year 2

Year 2 have thoroughly enjoyed learning all about nursing throughout history; comparing the famous historical figures Florence Nightingale, Mary Seacole and Edith Cavell; and looking at the amazing changes they made for nursing. In Block 4, we will be focusing on geography, specifically North America, in our 'Road Trip Across America' unit.

In writing, we have enjoyed writing a character description of a hippo named Hercules and a instructions for making a shrub sandwich based on the book 'The First Hippo on the Moon'. We are currently reading 'Where Dragons Fly' and are excited use this to create some wonderful pieces of writing.



In maths, Year 3 have been learning all about fractions. This includes how to add and subtract fractions with the same denominator and finding a fraction of a given amount. We are now moving on to ordering fractions from smallest to biggest.

In writing, we are creating a narrative based off a book we have read in class called 'The Iron Man'. We will be coming up with our own ideas on how to capture the Iron Man.

On Friday 26th January, we will be having an Ancient Egyptian experience day where the children can come in dressed as an Ancient Egyptian. We will be studying the mummification process and practising some artwork.







Year 4 and 5

In Year 4 and 5, the children have had a positive start to the new year.

Year 4

In Year 4, the children have been focusing on their Times Table knowledge in preparation for the MTC (Multiplication Tables Check) that is upcoming in May.

The children will be going to Woburn Safari Park in March, where they will have the opportunity to see a variety of animals and will receive a talk from an expert at the Park.

In writing, the children have been enjoying writing about their previous reading book - Cakes in Space. They will soon be writing a travel guide based on this.

Year 5

Year 5 children enjoyed their trip to the Space Centre in Leicester where they were able to apply their science knowledge. Year 5 also have their Cathedral trip to look forward to towards to end of March.

In Year 5, the children have recently been learning about Henry VII and have taken this learning into their writing lessons where they will be writing a diary entry as Henry VII. The children also have a Tudor day later in the year where they will be able to apply their knowledge.















Year 6

Year 6 have had a busy and productive start to the Spring Term. We have lots to look forward to this term.

The children will be meeting an author next week at Gladstone Community Centre which will give the children a great insight into how creative writing is made. This will be a great opportunity for the children to ask questions.

With SATs on the horizon, the children are continuing to use CGP books both inside and outside of school to support with their learning. Year 6 currently have a big focus on developing reading comprehension and are reading a variety of text types to help with this.

Children have started their auditions for their performance which will be showcased later in the year.
