British Values

The Academy promotes values which ensure that our students develop a strong sense of social and moral responsibility. We prepare students for the life in modern Britain because values such as individual liberty, democracy, the law mutual respect and tolerance are embedded within the curriculum and the ethos at Fulbridge Academy.

In addition, these values are also promoted at various times throughout the year. Our curriculum is broad and balanced, complies with legislation and provides a wide range of subjects which help prepare students for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life in Modern Britain.

It actively promotes the fundamental British values and it extends beyond the classroom with a wide range of visits and experiences. It promotes tolerance and respect for people of all faiths (or none), cultures and lifestyles through effective spiritual, moral, social and cultural developments of pupils, including by engaging pupils in extracurricular activity and volunteering in the local community. It is supported by a well rounded programme of assemblies and Citizenship & Ethics lessons which offer a clear guidance of what is right and wrong.
